THE PASTOR'S PEACE

Well, I am writing this on September 25th. For those who have followed the news, I guess that means that the Rapture has not happened, or I wasn't raptured. For those who don't know what I'm talking about, it involves a pastor in South Africa who claimed he received a vision from Christ. The vision showed him that the Rapture would be happening on September 23rd or 24th, but here I am on the 25th. Right now, we are working our way through the book of Revelation in a seven-week Tuesday night Bible Study. It is interesting that such a prediction about the Rapture was made, as we were just talking about all of the people and times that the second coming of Christ has been predicted. Even though there are scripture readings that state we will not know the time or day, and even though Revelation is anything but clear, there is still this temptation to predict such things. It makes sense though; we always would like to know what tomorrow brings.

Trying to predict the future takes place in many parts of our world. From weather forecasts to stock market predictions, we are always trying to see if we can know in advance what will be happening. Some of this is wanting to be prepared for the future, but I think part of it is that we are probably anxious about the future as well. It can seem like something bad is just around the corner, and any reassurance that we can have contrary to this idea is comforting. Of course, the future need not always be one that is bad. Although a popular view about the end of the world involves there being a great calamity at some point, this is not necessarily going to be the case. Also, even if it is, we have no idea when this might be. How silly would it be if we spent all of our time worrying about something that won't happen for another 500 years.

Instead of dreading tomorrow, I try to have hope for the future. After all, if we believe that Christ is in the world always, that should give us some comfort. People have sometimes asked me what I do believe in terms of the second coming of Christ. I do believe that there is a reality beyond this one, and that ultimately through God all will become one in it, but in terms of a timeline, I have no idea. Instead, I choose to focus on my faith life and to try to discern what Christ is calling me to do in the here and now. If I can do that, then I don't really need to worry about what tomorrow brings. As I jokingly say, if you are doing your job, then you don't need to worry about when the boss is coming back. Let us all have hope and know that no matter what tomorrow brings we will always have each other and the love of Christ.


